The C.H.A.M.P.S program is an enrichment program that helps support the regular school program and provides a safe option for students after school.

All staff members who directly supervise pupils must meet the minimum qualifications, hiring requirements, and procedures for an instructional aide in the school district.

A nutritious snack is provided daily to students participating in the program.

The C.H.A.M.P.S. goals are to increase student achievement, increase school attendance and create a positive safe environment for students.



McFarland CHAMPS Program serves students in 1st through 8th grade. Students participate in homework time and enrichment activities that include the following:

1. Homework assistance

An educational and literacy component in which tutoring or homework assistance is provided in language arts, mathematics, history social sciences, computer training and science.

2. Enrichment Activity
