McFarland Unified School District (MUSD) developed a written LEA-Level Parent and Family Engagement Policy with input from Title I parents. The Policy applies to all parents and family members in MUSD served under Title I, Part A. District English Language Advisory Committee (DELAC) and District Advisory Committee (DAC) members will review the policy during fall semester, DELAC and DAC members will evaluate the policy and provide in writing necessary changes as part of our yearly revision process. MUSD will amend the policy based on DELAC and DAC input and by incorporating the changes to the policy.

MUSD parents and family members are involved by providing input and feedback through the Annual Parent/Family Survey. This assessment will be given annually and asks parents their opinion regarding student learning, whether the school has adequate resources, and how satisfied families are with the frequency and quality of information they receive regarding their children. Data from the survey assists the District and schools in developing support and improvement strategies.

Parents are informed with their neighborhood school's participation in the Title I program, what the requirements are, and their right to be involved at each school's Title I meeting during Back to School Night. In addition, the Principal will hold various parent meetings and will discuss the Title I program and their rights (School Site Council, ELAC)

MUSD engages and communicates with stakeholders to gather input topics related to family engagement and disseminates information to school sites. MUSD provides assistance and necessary support to all site administrators.

- 1. MUSD schedules necessary training for administrative development opportunities for each schools' Principal (Title I coordinator) should they need. The principal directly oversees implementation of parent and family involvement activities. MUSD supports nationwide programs that support parent involvement through weekly/biweekly meetings.
- 2. MUSD District Title I Coordinator works with school site principals to provide necessary information, materials and training opportunities that are regularly shared and presented at the sites' parent committee meetings.
- 3. MUSD meets to collaborate with stakeholders such as the District Advisory Committee and outside community partners/groups/businesses. This information helps MUSD monitor the effectiveness of family engagement and provide the opportunity to make necessary revisions. Stakeholders are made up of representatives of the district's demographics which include parents, community members, teachers, staff, and others

MUSD will focus on supporting parent involvement at DELAC and at DAC and provide Title I information and support to the all school sites:

District Policies on School Committees or Councils and Title I mandates:

- 1. Provides all school sites with operating guidance and federal requirements for School Site Councils, English Learner Advisory Committees (ELAC) and Title I.
- 2. LCAP Annual Survey provides parents with an opportunity to give feedback on matters related to academic quality and student learning.
- 3. Assist schools and parents in identifying allowable school expenditures to solicit more parent involvement in the school review and improvement process.

MUSD conducts an annual evaluation of the Annual Parent and Family Engagement Policy at DELAC and DAC committee meetings. Committee members represent all six of the District's school sites. The communication that occurs between the District and committee members allows for information to be delivered and shared with other parents and community members at each school site (PAC and ELAC) councils and committees.

MUSD annually reviews the District Parent and Family Engagement Policy with DELAC and DAC parent/student groups. The review process will consist of the following:

- 1. Identify needs of all parents and families, specifically for those of various subgroups identified in the question, to partner with their child's school for student academic success.
- 2. Strategize ways to overcome participation barriers and develop successful partnerships with families to increase student achievement.
- 3. Promote the parent and family engagement policy survey completion.
- 4. Continue collecting information regarding services available and provided to our families. Provide data to DELAC and DAC groups and include them in the LCAP.
- 5. Review data from the LCAP Annual Parent/Family Survey to understand the impact of parent engagement efforts. Share the data with DELAC and DAC groups

MUSD annually reviews feedback data from DELAC and DAC groups to determine the need for revision of the Title I Parent and Family Engagement Policy. Conclusions and findings from various parent surveys will be utilized to develop more effective engagement of parents and families. The best practices and strategies identified by DELAC and DAC parent groups will be shared with site principals to strengthen parent engagement and communication between schools and families.
